

Birds of the Wissahickon

In Philadelphia, the Wissahickon Valley is a steep and rugged gorge cut by the Wissahickon Creek, located in Northwest Philadelphia. It is part of Fairmount Park, the largest municipally-owned park in the United States and it extends for seven miles from Harpers Meadow to the Schuylkill River. The Wissahickon's 1,850 acres of woodlands, fields and streamside corridors provide habitat for a wide variety of birdlife.

This list includes birds that are seen in the park and also those that are only seen overhead, but on a fairly regular basis. There are 167 species on the list, including 66 species that breed in the area. Birds that have been seen only a few times during the past 20 years (i.e. Mississippi Kite; Common Moorhen, etc.) are not listed, nor are many waterfowl that are seen in reservoirs and major waterways in other areas of Philadelphia, but seldom -- if ever -- over or in the Wissahickon, such as ruddy duck, canvasback, scoters, etc.

Carpenters Woods, a small wooded section of the park dominated by tall oaks, has proven to be the best area to observe spring warbler migration. All 35 species of warblers that have been observed in the Wissahickon have also been found in Carpenters Woods.

This list is in accordance with the Seventh American Ornithological Union check-list, with the exception of vultures and owls, which are included under Raptors.

This bird list has been a project of the Wildlife Committee of the Friends of the Wissahickon, in cooperation with the Fairmount Park Commission. Additional information has been provided by members of the Wyncote Chapter of the National Audubon Society and of the Delaware Valley Ornithological Club.
